A **Replacement** degree certificate can be issued when your original certificate has been lost, stolen, destroyed, not received or damaged. If you have simply mislaid your original certificate or require a second copy for occasions when you do not wish to release your original certificate you should order a **True Copy**, as you are still in possession of the original certificate. Only one (1) Replacement Degree or True Copy can be ordered for each award.

To order a Replacement or True Copy:

- 1) Complete Personal Details and Award Details below
- 2) If ordering a Replacement or if it's your **second** True Copy complete the Statutory Declaration.

NB, If you are ordering a Replacement and your Certificate has been damaged you can simply return your damaged certificate without completing the Statutory Declaration

3) Submit completed form and full colour scan of Photo ID via askUWA (web.uwa.edu.au/askuwa) or post to:

4) Once the form has been received, the Graduations Team will email you with a payment link (price list below). Your replacement or true copy will be processed within 20 working days from receipt of payment or completed form
